
Our mission is made stronger by the support of our partner agencies. They are essential to meeting the need on the ground level.

In 2017, we were selected to help run the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) in some of our Florida counties, which helps bridge the gap in meals many seniors face every month. Our seniors often express gratitude for the extra food they receive. Over 42,000 meals have been provided to seniors in need since we began this program.

CHILD NUTRITION

WE PROVIDED **1,829,177** MEALS/SNACKS TO **21,760** CHILDREN* THROUGH OUR CHILD NUTRITION PROGRAMS.

Imagine as the bus stops to let students off at school, one out of every four kids walks a little slower than the rest, unenergized and hungry because they went to bed without a meal the night before. To address the issue of child hunger, we operate multiple programs to provide children with healthy meals. We partner with parks and recreation sites, schools and local community resource centers to provide meals to children along with enrichment activities, such as nutrition education, in a safe location.

LAST YEAR OVER 2,400 CHILDREN WERE PROVIDED WITH BACKPACKS TO TAKE HOME ON THE WEEKENDS DURING THE SCHOOL YEAR.

BENEFITS OUTREACH

OUR TEAM HELPED COMPLETE **3,823** SNAP* APPLICATIONS, GENERATING AN ESTIMATED **3,835,710** MEALS IN 2017.

Our Outreach Program works with many community partners, like The Open Door Pantry, to reach households struggling with hunger who may qualify for benefits. Carolyn's pantry serves many senior citizens, but more and more they see an increase in teenagers, young adults, and small children who need assistance finding essential nutrition.

*Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (Formerly Food Stamps) When we connect clients with benefits, it frees up their budgets and helps remove a little stress from our pantries. Last year, benefits had an estimated local economic stimulation of almost \$20,000,000 in Alabama and Mississippi.

LAST YEAR OUR OUTREACH PROGRAM REACHED OVER 1,200 SENIORS AND ALMOST 1,000 CHILDREN IN NEED.

FOOD RESCUE

OUR BASE OF **181** RETAIL STORE PARTNERS DONATED **12,650,979** POUNDS, WHICH INCLUDED **75%** FRESH PRODUCT.

We aim to improve the quality of our clients' diets by critically examining the nutritional quality of our food and working with feeding partners and clients to ensure a healthy diet. In an effort to increase our distribution of fresh product, we work with many local store partners to rescue food that otherwise would have gone to waste. These generous store donors contribute to over 50% of our food inventory.

Last year we placed an emphasis on establishing partnerships with local farmers, producers, and other non-traditional suppliers to procure over 1 million pounds of fresh. local produce. Our donors, ranging from large scale farmers to hobby growers, want to share their food with people in their communities. We are committed to cultivating relationships with growers and community partners to source excess fresh produce and distribute it among the more than 386,000 food insecure individuals in the communities we serve.


