Food Insecurity Statistics

A meal OFFERS HOPE

The latest *Map the Meal Gap* study confirms that hunger remains a widespread issue, present in every state and varying by location and population.

Across the central Gulf Coast, the study shows that food insecurity has risen by 4.61% to 16.2%, affecting nearly 385,000 people. Among children, the reality is especially alarming. More than 109,000 of our local children face hunger, with rates ranging from 13.6% in Santa Rosa County, Florida, to 36.1% in Conecuh County, Alabama. Feeding the Gulf Coast serves nearly 200,000 people monthly in response to this growing demand.

Rural counties across the South are hit hardest. Many households earn too much to qualify for federal nutrition programs such as SNAP, yet still fall short of affording groceries consistently. Rising grocery prices only widen this gap. Combined with ongoing inflation and unemployment, more families are being pushed into food insecurity.

These mounting challenges highlight the essential role of local hunger relief efforts. Community support and effective policy solutions are critical to closing the meal gap and ensuring no one has to choose between food and other basic needs like utilities or prescription medicine.

Data-Driven Decisions

A meal SPARKS CHANGE

To better address hunger, we must first understand the unique demographics of the communities we serve and the challenges our neighbors face as they navigate the charitable system.

Since 2019, Feeding the Gulf Coast has advanced its Service Insights initiative, a multi-phase effort that uses data to guide where and how we serve most effectively. By gathering local insights, we gain a clearer picture of the barriers families experience and can build more tailored solutions.

This work goes beyond numbers—it is about creating real change in people's lives. As one partner agency shared, **"Knowing our client's dietary needs will help us have a better selection of food."** Each piece of information allows us to connect families with the right resources, offering dignity and ensuring they have access to the nourishment they need.

A meal sparks lasting change when paired with understanding and strategy. Through Service Insights, Feeding the Gulf Coast can better measure the impact of hunger and maximize efficiency as it directs services to where it is needed most.



RECOVERY RESOURCES

The food bank partners with various organizations, including those that provide recovery resources to individuals facing challenges beyond food insecurity.

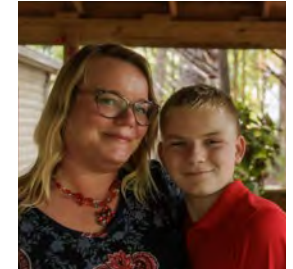
These partnerships are strengthened through the collective power of a shared mission to reduce hunger in our community and move individuals from crisis to stability.



SENIOR MEAL BOXES

With limited resources for necessities, many seniors struggle to afford nutritious food. The food bank operates Senior Programs to provide a monthly food box for qualifying older adults.

Through the NEST and CSFP Programs, Feeding the Gulf Coast distributed more than 7,000 boxes of food monthly to seniors in need last year.



BENEFITS OUTREACH

Families often need additional support to make ends meet. Many hardworking parents, some holding two jobs, still struggle to cover basic expenses.

Feeding the Gulf Coast connects seniors, working parents, and individuals rebuilding their lives with benefits that ease tight budgets and provide relief during temporary crises.

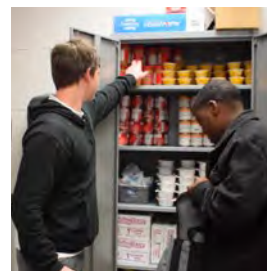
Child Nutrition Programs

A meal **FUELS** the **MIND**

A counselor at a partner high school described the powerful role food plays in learning, **“Our partnership with Feeding the Gulf Coast has enabled us to build relationships with families facing homelessness through the simple act of kindness—sharing food. Food insecurity is real for many of our families and can cause a child to miss school or struggle to focus in class due to hunger.”**

Children deserve the nourishment necessary to grow, learn, and thrive—every day, in and out of the classroom. Yet hunger remains a barrier for too many kids locally. Research from No Kid Hungry shows that 40% of parents worry food will run out before the end of the month, leaving children undernourished and unable to stay focused.

Feeding the Gulf Coast addresses this need through multiple child nutrition programs, providing nearly 1.5 million meals and snacks to 20,000 children last year. Each meal eases hunger and fuels the mind—helping kids learn, build confidence, and work toward a brighter future.



BACKPACK & SCHOOL PANTRIES

Last year, we partnered with more than 200 schools to distribute nearly 684,000 meals through our Backpack and School Pantry programs, which reduce child hunger by providing food to kids on the weekends.

Counselors and teachers echo the impact these meals have on children returning to school Monday morning, ready to learn.



SUMMER MEALS PROGRAM

Last summer, nearly 13,000 children received more than 364,500 meals and snacks through the Summer Meals Program, helping fill the gap left when school is out.

Partnering with local sites, the program eases the strain on family budgets and ensures children have consistent access to healthy meals during the summer months.

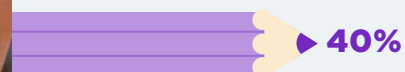


AFTERSCHOOL MEALS PROGRAM

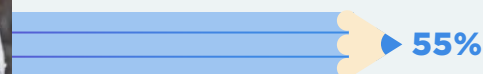

Last year, we partnered with 60 sites to provide nearly 9,500 children with more than 443,400 meals and snacks.

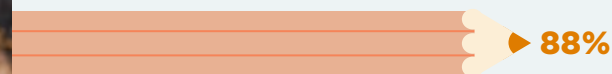

Food Procurement

A meal **CONNECTS** *us*

Feeding the Gulf Coast partners with more than 300 retail stores and local farmers to rescue and source nutritious food for our neighbors. These partnerships are vital, not only for reducing food waste but also for improving the diet quality of those we serve. By sourcing directly from growers and produce suppliers, we can offer a wider variety of healthy foods to households who might otherwise lack access.

As a result of these combined efforts, **we sourced nearly 12.3 million pounds of fruits and vegetables last year—making up 31% of all food procured.** This focus on fresh produce demonstrates our commitment to more than just feeding families; it ensures they have the type of food needed for better health and brighter futures.

A meal connects us by bridging farms, stores, volunteers, and families, uniting the entire community in the fight against hunger.

Community Health & Nutrition

A meal NOURISHES

As Millie, the Mobile Market, made her rounds, a mother arrived with her energetic young son to shop for affordable fresh produce. From the outside, you might not know the challenges they were facing. Her little boy was preparing for surgery, and she had recently been diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis and tumors in her right frontal lobe.

With mounting expenses, even basic needs felt impossible.

“Having to pay for several medical bills, it’s hard to be able to afford the things my son needs,” she shared. **“You have to decide, are your bills more important or are your child’s needs?”**

Thanks to the Mobile Market, she left that day with fresh, healthy food to nourish her family during a difficult time. For her, the visit meant one less impossible choice—a reminder that access to food brings relief, strength, and hope.



HEALTHCARE PARTNERSHIPS

Last year, Feeding the Gulf Coast partnered with USA Health and Watershed Health to pilot an initiative connecting patients with nutritious food and other resources as part of their treatment and recovery.

This effort builds on growing evidence that nutrition plays a vital role in lowering hospital readmissions and supporting long-term health goals.



NUTRITION EDUCATION

Through science-based classes, our nutrition education specialists equip participants with practical steps for healthy eating and meal planning. Last year, our nutrition educators taught nearly 800 participants in more than 75 in-person classes and reached an additional 4,500 individuals through other educational opportunities.



MOBILE MARKET PROGRAM

Millie, the Mobile Market, connects communities with limited access to nutritious food to an affordable source of fresh, local produce, saving neighbors an average of 23% compared to traditional grocery stores. Last year, the program distributed 6,500 pounds of produce through nearly 50 events across the Florida panhandle.

Community Partnerships

A meal **BUILDS COMMUNITY**

For our mission to be fully activated, the food bank relies on the hands and feet of partner agencies—many of which are led by volunteers and older adults. In 2024, of the 35 million meals we distributed, more than 31 million reached families and individuals through these agencies and mobile pantries. Each meal represents more than nourishment—it's a thread that stitches together a stronger, more compassionate community.

Our partner agencies are a lifeline during life's hardest seasons. For someone seeking food assistance for the first time, the experience can feel overwhelming and uncertain. That's where community steps in. With the support of volunteers and donors, we ensure that a meal not only meets a physical need but also delivers hope, helping families move from crisis toward stability.

As one grandmother shared, **"This helps out tremendously. I can actually breathe, and now so can my son and daughter-in-law. With this [food], I know that my grandkids get some snacks and the healthy food that they need, or at least the majority of what they need."** Her words remind us that a meal builds more than strength—it builds community, connection, and a future where no one faces hunger alone.
